1. Flock name - typically this is the name of your farm or your last name.
2. Flock Number - your numbering system to identify your sheep. Example: numerical number such as 99-1, 99-2, 99-3, etc.; or a combination of numbers and letters. This is your own identification system for your sheep and can be any of the above.
3. Sire, Flock Name and Number - this must be exactly as listed on the Certificate of Registry for this animal to allow traceability. You cannot rename the animal; for example, but a new ram and rename him with your farm name. This destroys all traceability in the flock book.
4. Dam, Flock Name and Number - same rules as sire.
5. Breeder - the owner of the dam at the time of breeding. If she is bred by a ram owned by someone else, the Certificate of Breeding must be filled out and signed by the ram owner.
6. Owner - owner of dam at time of lambing.
